

LIBRARYCRAFT: FAQ

Is LibraryCraft free?

Yes! If you have a registered copy of Minecraft Java Edition already, it is free to use LibraryCraft.

Do I need to visit a library or be a library member to play?

No! LibraryCraft is available from home 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. We would love you to join the library however you do not need your own library card to play LibraryCraft.

What device can I play LibraryCraft on?

LibraryCraft can be played on PC, Mac, and Linux, on Java Edition only.

What software do I need to play LibraryCraft?

You need either: Minecraft Java Edition (for PC, Mac or Linux).

What if I don't have a copy of Minecraft?

You can purchase a copy of Java Edition for around \$40 from [Minecraft.net](https://minecraft.net). Make sure you select to **play on Computer with Java Edition**.

Do I need an internet connection to play?

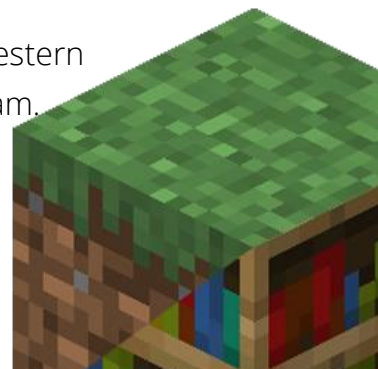
Yes, LibraryCraft is an online game, so you will need an internet connection to get access and play.

I'm too young/too old. Can I still join?

Unfortunately no. You must be aged between 7 and 17 to play. If you are interested in becoming a moderator and are aged 18+, get in contact with LibraryCraft admin by emailing librarycraft@fremantle.wa.gov.au and we will get in touch.

Why does the City of Fremantle and other Local Governments' names keep appearing?

LibraryCraft is a program run and supported by many libraries in Western Australia. Fremantle Library looks after administration of the program.



How do I join and what information do you need?

You will need to complete the online form at librarycraft.net/join/ and provide details including name and age of player, parents email address and Java Edition Username. You will need to send the player's proof of age to the email listed, before the player is whitelisted.

What happens with the proof of age documents I send?

Once we have verified your age, the documents are deleted. We only need to verify them to comply with our esafety policy for the program.
